

Credentialing Reminder for Nurse Practitioners in Behavioral Health September 29, 2025

Neighborhood Health Plan of Rhode Island (Neighborhood) would like to remind providers of credentialing requirements for nurse practitioners (NPs) applying to provide behavioral health (BH) services. Neighborhood's credentialing department has recently seen credentialing applications denied because the NP did not hold the appropriate license for behavioral health. To avoid delays or denials, please review the requirements below.

Nurse Practitioner Credentialing for Behavioral Health

- NPs must hold a Psychiatric/Mental Health Nurse Practitioner (PMHNP) license to be credentialed for BH services.
- NPs credentialed under other focus areas must also be licensed as a PMHNP to provide BH services.
- This requirement applies only to BH services. NPs credentialed under other specialties may continue to provide medical services within their scope of practice.

Credentialing Process Reminder

- Credentialing may take up to 45 days once all required information is received.
- Applications submitted without the required license will be denied.
